

HIGHLIGHTS – 3 MAY 2011

Annual General Meeting

Dr Hamish Ross, Mrs Liz Robertson and Mr Stephen Holland were elected Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer respectively for a further year. Dr Ross gave his annual report which referred to the need for possible new members since Community Council elections would be held next year. The annual accounts for 2010-2011 were approved. Two projects – the repair of the pillars and the installation of protective bollards at the foot of Roseburn Cliff – had been completed and paid for. The accounts showed a surplus for the year of £1031. The date of the next Annual General Meeting was provisionally fixed as 15 May 2012.

Ordinary Meeting

Western Corner Regeneration

The work had been completed. The resiting of the bus stop in Saugtonhall Drive away from the parking bays was to be discussed with the City Council by Lothian Buses.

Roseburn Terrace improvements

The planning enforcement officer was not proposing to contest the display of advertisements outside the shops because they were not considered to be seriously detrimental. The air monitoring unit which was due for removal remained in place. The chairman would write to the City Council about possible measures to reduce pollution.

Donaldson Area Amenity Association

A possible realignment of the eastern boundary of the Donaldson area had been discussed at the Association's AGM. The inclusion of the area within the boundaries of Murrayfield Community Council would be raised again in the 2012 review of the City's Community Councils.

Trams

A special meeting of the City Council would take place on 16 May when a report on the future of the tram project would be considered.

Concerts at Murrayfield Stadium

A request would be made to the police for the Community Council to be represented at meetings to plan the policing of the two concerts to be held in June.

Vision for Edinburgh

Riccardo Marini had been unable to attend the meeting to give a presentation, but a public meeting would be arranged on a future date for which he was available.

Publicity

It was agreed that flyers to publicise the work of the Community Council should be produced and distributed in September this year and again in

February/ March next year. These would encourage members of the community to raise issues of concern with the Community Council.

Future Meetings

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 2 August in the Upper Room of Murrayfield Parish Church Centre at 8pm. Future meetings will take place on Wednesday 14 September, Tuesday 1 November and Wednesday 14 December. Members of the public are welcome to attend these meetings.
